WEILAND. -- *The Imperial Army of France and its Allies*. Weimar, 1807 and 1812. -- (148) plates in-12, colored. Precious collection, giving not only the uniforms of the troops of the First Empire, but also those of the contingents of the Confederation of the Rhine, Italians and Poles.

Officer of the Life Guards Corps. -- Grenadier of the Guard of the Grand Duchy of Baden. -- Baden infantry officer. -- Infantry of the Grand Duchy of Baden. -- Jäger of the Grand Duchy of Baden. -- Officer of Baden Dragoons. -- Dragoon of the Grand Duchy of Baden. -- Officer of Baden Hussars. -- Artilleryman of Baden.

After HERZBERG. -- *True portraits of all the military costumes of the monarchs of Europe*. -- Herzberg, 1800-1814. Augsburg, K. K. Akademische Kunsthandlung. -- 97 plates in-4<sup>th</sup>, carefully colored. -- In this important collection, each nation is represented by an issue of 5 plates (generally 2 plates for the infantry, 2 for the cavalry and 1 for the artillery, the latter always enlarged); each sheet contains several characters. France, Bavaria and Saxony have each been the subject of two issues; the Bavarian Militia form an issue of 7 plates; finally, a notebook of 5 sheets includes the Portuguese Legion, Frankfurt, Würzburg, Hesse-Darmstadt and Reuss-Schwarzburg. The issue of Baden is number 13.

Infantry. Life Guard: grenadier, sergeant of grenadiers, officer. Regiment Erbprinz: officer, fusilier.<sup>1</sup> -- Light infantry. -- Cavalry: dragoons, hussars. -- Cavalry: light dragoons in the stables. -- Artillery.

BADEN (1806-1813). -- Suite of 12 watercolors, from the colored lithographs, without name of author, of the Royal Library and Körner-Museum of Dresden. (Mr. Balsan's collection.)

RICHARD KNÖTEL. -- *Uniformenkunde*. Rathenow, Max Babenzien. -- Publication started in 1890; each year forms an in-4° volume of 12 issues, each containing 5 colored plates, with notes, and 4 pages of text. The thirteenth volume of this very important book is being published. The number in Roman numerals indicates the volume; the number in Arabic numerals is that of the plate.
