regarding the uniforms of the troops of the Prince Primate

(1806-1814)

All the plates mentioned are colored.

WEILAND. -- *The Imperial Army of France and its Allies*. -- Weimar, 1807 and 1812. -- Plates in-12, colored. Important collection, giving not only the uniforms of the French troops of the First Empire, but also those of the contingents of the Confederation of the Rhine, Italians and Poles.

Infantry officer of the troops of Prince Primate. -- Infantry of the Prince Primate. -- Chasseur of the Prince-Primate.

from HERZBERG. -- *True portraits of all the military costumes of the monarchs of Europe*. -- Herzberg, K. K. Akademische Kunsthdlgung. Augsburg, 1800-1814. -- Collection of 97 plates in-4, colored with the greatest care, and appearing in parts of 5 sheets. The single plate concerning the troops of Frankfurt is part of the 18th part (Allied troops of France). It gives the following types:

Infantry Officer. -- Grenadier. -- Fusilier. -- Hussar.

Notebook of the Sabretache (November 1889). -- Reproduction of the plates from Herzberg, discussed above.

from MARTINET. -- *Foreign Troops*. -- Collection of colored plates, published between 1807 and 1815 by Martinet, bookseller, rue du Coq, Nos. 13 and 15, Paris. -- Very well documented pieces.

No. (19). Frankfurt Infantry. -- Chasseur.

No. (20). Frankfurt Infantry. -- Fusilier.

Manuscript of the Bourgeois of Hamburg. (Professor Suhr) -- Representation of the uniforms of all the troops which were confined to Hamburg, from 1806 to 1815. -- Album in-4 of 158 colored plates, copied by the care of the National Library from the copy of the Commercial Library of Hamburg.

PI. 138. -- Soldiers and officer of the Zweyer Regiment, Frankfurt.

PI. 139. -- Troops of the Prince-Primate. Sapper and officer.

PI. 140. -- Troops of the Prince Primate. - Musician, grenadier, fusilier and fielder.

RICHARD KNÖTEL. -- *Uniformenkunde.* -- Rathenow. Max Babenzien. -- Publication started in 1890; each year having an in-4 volume of 12 parts, each having 5 colored plates, and 4 pages of text. Each plate was accompanied by a note. This important work already contains ten volumes published; the eleventh is being published. -- The number in Roman numerals gives the volume; that in Arabic numerals, the plate.
